Nursery

Can you name the parts of a plant?

What happened in the story Jasper's Beanstalk?

Can you show someone at home an object that floats?

Reception

Topic: what are the different stages of a sunflower's life cycle?

English: what is the title and author of our new text?

Maths: can you name four 2D shapes?

Year 1

Science: Can you find a plant and label the stem, petal and leaves? (Where are the roots?)
