Teacher Angel

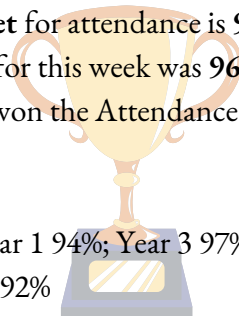

Nursery

- What habitat are we learning about this week?
