Listen up, Speak up | NSPCC

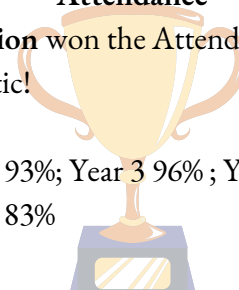
"It takes a village to raise a child. And it takes a community to keep children safe."

What Three Questions?

Nursery

We have been learning about jobs in the community. Can you tell someone at home what a paediatrician does for work?

Can you find some 3D shapes around the house?
