Listen up, Speak up | NSPCC

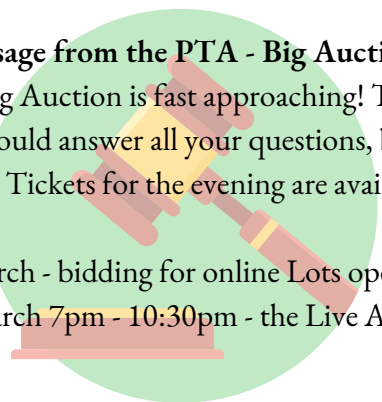
"It takes a village to raise a child. And it takes a community to keep children safe."

## Message from the PTA - Big Auction

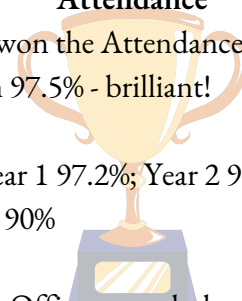
This year's Big Auction is fast approaching! The Q&A document should answer all your questions, but here are the key dates! Tickets for the evening are available on ParentMail.

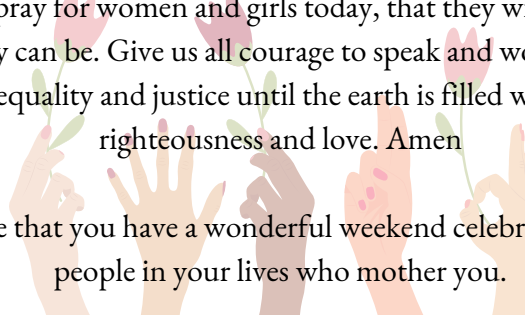

# What Three Questions?

## Nursery

What is your favourite story that we have read during Book Week?

What is one event that happened in the story 'The Princess and the Pea'?

We are learning about jobs in the community. How does a teacher help others?

## Reception

English: Who were the special people/characters in the baby's life in our book 'So Much'?

Maths: What is one more and one less than 5?

Phonics: What words can you think of that we can add 'ing' to?

## Year 1

Maths: Time: What time do you eat breakfast, lunch and dinner on the weekend? (use o'clock)

R.E: How does Jesus' journey to the cross, offer signs of hope to a Christian?
