Message from the PTA - Big Auction

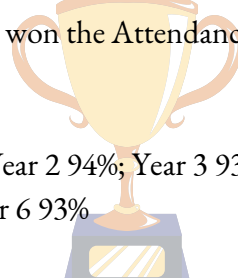
This year's Big Auction is fast approaching! There is a Q&A attached which should answer all your questions, but here are the key dates!

What Three Questions?

Nursery

Can you name what the houses were made of in The Three Little Pigs? What would you build your house out of?

Can you practise measuring an object using blocks?

Can you sing a nursery rhyme that we have been learning with someone at home?

Reception

Topic (Fairytale): what were the similarities and differences between the stories Cinderella and Yeh-Shen?

Maths: what is one more and one less than 4?

English: what might the trees say to Little Red as he wanders through the forest?

Year 1

Maths: What shapes have a curved face?

English: Can you write 5 words using our new suffix -est?

PSHE: What makes a good friend?

Year 2

Maths: How many 3D shapes can you find and name around your house?

History: What did Mary Seacole achieve in her life?

PE: How many burpees can you do in 1 minute?
Challenge someone at home to do the same!

Year 3

Science: What would happen to the poles if I broke a magnet?

English: Has the possessive apostrophe been used correctly in this sentence? 'She got the bread from mother's kitchen and we brought it down to the river to feed the duck's.'

Maths: How do you calculate perimeter?

Year 4

Maths: Can you provide the definitions of an obtuse, acute and right angle?

Science: Why do humans have two sets of teeth?

RE: What do we mean by the term 'Karma' and can you provide an example?

Year 5

English: We have a new study text – Unspoken. What is the story all about? How much are you able to explain what went on in America at the time that the story is set?

R.E: We are coming to the end of our learning on Hinduism. How much do you know about Hinduism? What do you know and how much can you explain about it?

Year 6

English: What are examples of figurative language?

Maths: If three angles in a pentagon total three hundred and eighty degrees and the remaining two are equal, what does each of the missing angles measure?

History: How was Britain able to stand firm against the German threat?
