Message from the PTA - Big Auction

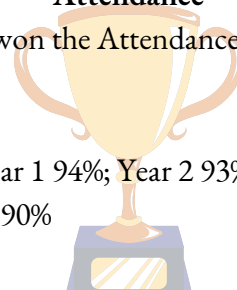
This year's Big Auction is fast approaching! The Q&A document should answer all your questions, but here are the key dates! Tickets for the evening are available on ParentMail.

What Three Questions?

Nursery

Can you name some of the characters in the story, 'The Elves and the Shoemaker'?

Can you draw a picture using the correct pencil grip?

Can you explain what a Vet's job is?

Reception

Literacy: What is one thing you enjoy doing with your family **so much**?

Maths: What numbers to 10 can be made of doubles?

Topic (Community People): What facts have we learnt about being a Doctor?

Year 1

Science: What are the similarities and differences between mammals and birds?

History: What did people used to do at the seaside?

Maths: Can you double 1? Then double the answer. Keep doubling the answer. How far can you get?

Year 2

Design Technology: Can you write down which fruit and vegetables you eat over the weekend?

Writing: What words rhyme with, chase, sailing, cat, boat and crow?

Maths: Can you show 5×2 , 4×10 , 3×2 , 4×5 with drawings?
