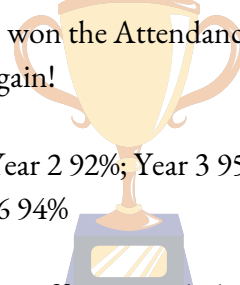
Message from the PTA - Big Auction

What Three Questions?

Nursery

In the story Cinderella, what did she leave behind when she was running?

What is your favourite fairy tale? Can you retell the story?

Can you measure two objects at home (using blocks, lego, spoons etc.) and say which is bigger and smaller.

Reception

English: how did Little Red help Grandma in our book?

Maths: what are some different ways to make 7?

Topic (Fairytales): where in the world have the Anansi the Spider Tales originated from?

Year 1

English: What is a sentence?

Maths: How many fingers and toes are in your family? Count in 5's and 10's!

Art: How do you make the secondary colours?

Year 2

History: Why should we remember Mary Seacole and Florence Nightingale?

PSHE: What are three good and bad things the sun can do?

English: Can you use noun phrases to create a description of your dream house?

Year 3

Spanish: How do you say ' I would like a kilo of mushrooms and onions please' in Spanish

Science: How can shadows move?
