Dear St Saviour's Families,

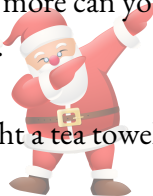

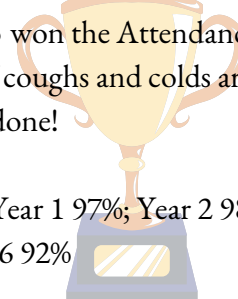

What is Thanksgiving?

Can you tell someone what food you would have for your Thanksgiving dinner?

Can you name different ways that we can feel?

Reception

Topic : Festivals - Thanksgiving

What 3 things are you thankful for today?

Maths: When we are counting a specific number, how do we know when to stop?

Phonics: We learnt 4 new digraphs this week - ch, sh, th and ng. Can you think of words that contain these digraphs?

Year 1

Maths: Using a ruler, can you measure 3 items at home and put them in height/length order?

English: Can you name 3 verbs, adjectives and nouns?

Science: What material would you use for a window and why?

Year 2

Mathematics: Can you add and subtract two 2-digit numbers. Remember to rearrange the numbers so the biggest is first!

English: Can you create a poster with facts about bears?

Science: Find 5 different food items and tell your family which food group they are in.

Year 3

Science: What is the function of a skeleton? Which type of skeleton do we have?

RE: What did the prophets foretell about the first Christmas?

Geography: What two words can be used to describe an Arid climate zone?

Year 4

Maths: How do we convert millilitres to litres?

Science: What do the words 'conductor' and 'insulator' mean and can you provide examples?

Geography: Can you name 3 characteristics of the Congo?

Year 5

English: What are the features of a playscript? Write a short playscript between two people at Paddington Station. Don't forget to include stage directions!

Maths: Two internal angles of a quadrilateral are 100° and 65° respectively. What could the other two angles be? Give three different possible pair options.

R.E: What are you thankful for? Write a short prayer giving thanks for the things that are important to you.

Geography: What are some physical features of the U.K?

English: What are the features of a film review?

Maths: What do you need to do to add improper fractions?
