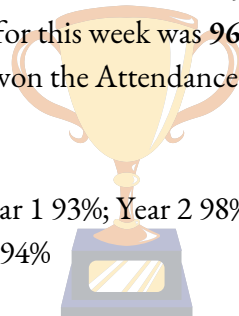


Attendance

What Three Questions?

Nursery

This week each child built a boat. Can you describe what it looked like?

Can you count a collection of objects (between 1 and 5) at home? E.g. blocks, stones, pencils.

How are you feeling? Can you remember what 'Zone of Regulation' this fits into?

E.g. Green Zone – happy, calm, ready to learn

Red Zone – angry, scared, frustrated

Yellow Zone – excited, nervous, silly

Blue Zone – sad, tired, sick

Reception

Maths: Can you find a large number of objects (20+) at home, arrange them in the way we learnt at school this week and then count them?

Topic (Our Wonderful World): what are some different materials that birds need to build a safe and comfortable nest?

Phonics: can you find the Tricky Words 'what', 'out' and 'when' in a book from home?

Year 1

Maths: What is ten more and ten less than 86?

English: Can you add the prefix -un to the following adjectives: kind, friendly, happy.

Geography: What's the difference between a rural and urban place?

Year 2

Maths: How many hundreds, tens and ones are in these numbers? 134, 178, 192, 144, 125

English: Can you tell a family member a story in past tense?

Art: Can you sketch a seaside landscape?

Maths: Can you explain the term 'negative numbers' and when might we see them?

Year 5

Science: What are the key stages of a human life cycle?

English: What is a glossary and what are the features of a glossary?

Art: What is a kiln and what is it used for?

Year 6

English: What are examples of direct and indirect speech?

Geography: How does my local area link in to the wider world?

Art: What is pop art?
