We have had confirmation that the school is going to be used as a Polling Station for the General Election on 4th July. School will be open for all children.

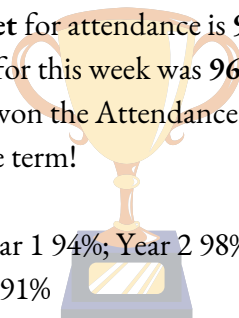
This does mean that we have had to change the date of the Open House event to **Friday 5th July**.
