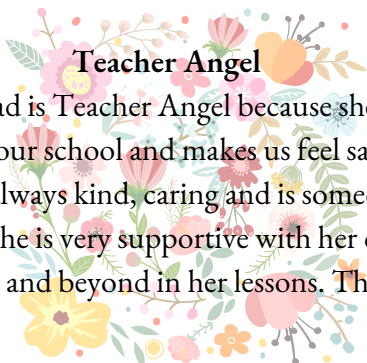

Teacher Angel

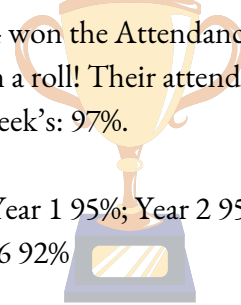

What Three Questions?

Nursery

Can you practise using a timer to take turns with another person?

What are some ingredients you need to cook gingerbread men?

Can you practise writing the numbers 1-5 with someone at home?

Reception

English: What colour do we see repeating throughout the illustrations of the book 'The Magic Paintbrush'? Why is this colour important?

Topic: In the fairytale story of Aladdin there is a lamp - how does this lamp differ from the lamps we have nowadays?

Maths: What does it mean for two groups of objects to be equal? What does 'unequal' mean?

Year 1
