

What Three Questions?

Nursery

We have been learning about the life cycle of humans. Can you remember the stages?

This week our caterpillars arrived. What will they turn into next?

We have been practising our numbers and shapes. Can you point out any you see at home or on walks?

Reception

Maths: What are doubles (in relation to number)? Can you show doubles using your fingers?

Topic (Our Wonderful World): Can you label the parts of a plant?

Phonics: What can the suffix 's' do to a word (e.g. dog/dogs) and how does it change its meaning?

Year 1

Science: What's the difference between a fruit and a vegetable?

English: What is a rhyming word?

Phonics: Can you revise all your phase 5 sounds?

Year 2

English: What is the difference between fiction and non-fiction?

Maths: what is $89-23=?$ How can you check your work using the inverse law of maths?

Science: what is the difference between a habitat and microhabitat?

Year 3

Science: What do you think made your team's plant grow well/badly?

Maths: Using your number facts, solve: $56 \div 4$ and $104 \div 8$.

RE: Can you remember all 8 concepts from the Big Story of the Bible?

Year 4

P.E: What 3 things are important when batting in cricket?

DT: Can you name 3 different lever systems?

PSHE: How can we make ourselves feel better when we are in the red zone?

Year 5

History: How did Victorians move their boats through tunnels and what was the name for this?

R.E: What is a pilgrimage?

English: What can we predict?

Year 6

Science: What is the function of the heart and what is its role in the circulatory system?

R.E: What are rules and why do we have them?

Maths: How are fractions with different denominators added and subtracted?
