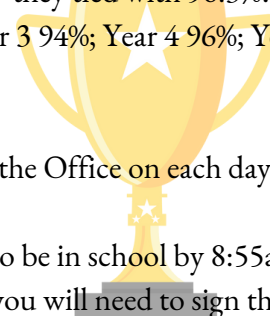

What Three Questions?

Nursery

This week we have been learning about Thanksgiving. Can you tell your parents some of the types of food Americans typically eat on the day?

We discussed being thankful. Can you tell your family some things you are thankful for?

Nursery has been practising our Nativity songs. Can you sing your family "Off We Go" ?

Maths: Two angles of a triangle are 65° and 45° . What is the size of the third angle?

Year 6

Science: What are the advantages and disadvantages of the industrial revolution?

Geography: What are the physical characteristics of the United Kingdom?

English: What were the poetic devices used this week in your poems?
