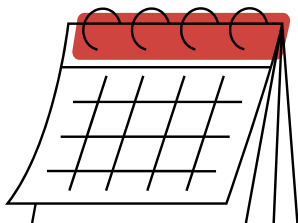

Uniform

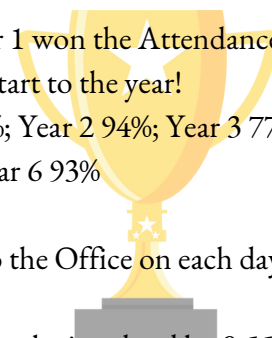
