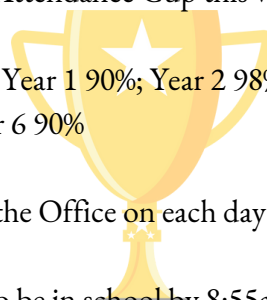

What Three Questions?

Nursery

Our book of the week was Goldilocks and the Three Bears. Can you tell your family the story?

Fr Chris visited on Thursday and he answered all Nursery's questions. What did he say was his favourite colour?

We have been learning about sizing this week. Can you find three things in your room that are big, medium and small and put them in size order.

Reception
