What Three Questions?

Nursery

RE: What would you put in your Magic Box' to represent you? e.g. paint brush because you enjoy art

Maths: Can you show the numbers to 5 using your fingers?

Topic 'All About Me': Can you talk about what makes you special? How are you different to your family members?

Reception

Maths: Can you find groups of 4 different items around your house?

PSHE: What makes a good friend?

Literacy: Can you say / write the alphabet?

Year 1

Maths: What does it mean to find 1 less than a number? How can our fingers help us?

English: How can we use the word 'and' to join our ideas when we are writing?

RE: How do you think Christians should take care of God's creation?

Year 2

Geography: What activities do they use the river Zambezi for?

Computing: What technology do we use at school?

R.E: Why do Jewish people celebrate Yom Kippur?

Year 3

English: If you infer someone's emotions, what are you doing?

RE: What does suffering mean? Can you think of examples?

Science: Can you remember any differences between sedimentary and metamorphic rocks?

Year 4

PSHE: Name a helpful and unhelpful distraction. Are your examples internal or external?

Computing: What is the internet?

Geography: What is a weir?
